High quality dialogue. The student is able to carefully consider the quality of each comment before answering or moving on to the next topic. Student orientation. Students are expected to read all of their fellow students' work, but they can only actively participate in those parts of the work that best suit their needs.

Access to resources. It is easy to connect experts or students from other educational institutions. It is also very important that you can access resources and information from all over the world.

2. Savings

As a rule, online courses are cheaper than regular classes in general education schools or vocational schools:

No travel and accommodation costs in class;

The student can continue to be at his place of work during classes.

3. Technology

You can work on the course almost anywhere you have access to a computer. Online courses provide an opportunity to get acquainted with new technologies and practice the use of office software, the Internet.

4. Additional benefits

You will work with classmates not only from all over the US, but from all over the world.

No discrimination among students on the basis of race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, nationality, age, clothing, appearance.

Equal participation of all classmates. There won't be the most outgoing student who can monopolize the discussion.

Online courses are best suited for introverts, as well as those who learn with visual cues and take longer to understand the material.

No problem with immigration.

A high level of dynamic interaction between the teacher and students, as well as between the students themselves. Cons of online learning

Problematic for teachers.

1. Limited social interaction

Opportunities for teachers and other students are limited:

Especially in self-paced courses. It is difficult to develop relationships with teachers and other classmates.

The likelihood of limited local network capabilities.

Much of the communication is via email, chat or discussion groups rather than offline hangouts.

The lack of an individual approach on the part of the teacher in relation to personal communication and communication.

There is no student atmosphere that is needed to create social interaction.

2. Technology cost and planning

Boot time of the computer, programs and Internet connection.

Students may be required to learn a new or improved computer. You may need skills to troubleshoot computer problems.

Additional charges for high speed internet.

Having to take the course while you work (unless your employer allows you to take the online course in the office).

Planning and adjusting the training schedule in accordance with the teacher's work schedule. For example, east coast vs west coast in the US, international course or student.

If a student plans to study at night, then he will have to wait for a response from the teacher or classmates until the next day.

3. Evaluation efficiency

Most educators agree that memory testing is not the best learning measure in any environment, but tools for learning in such a classroom are difficult to implement. It is difficult to evaluate the results of the program. The question remains: do students learn what the teacher says they should learn?

4. Problematic for teachers

Offline education

Advantages:

Flaws:

- If a student can't make it to class, you can't reschedule it. It is easier with courses where there is a video recording of classes that you can watch in your free time.
- The student is tied to a certain place and group, which makes it more difficult to combine with work / study or other activities. Sometimes the desired courses may not be in the city.
- If a student acts as a teacher, you can relate to this new paradigm of learning with varying degrees of enthusiasm and interest. Ask yourself a few questions:

As noted in the work of Naumenko U.V., quite effective in the study of languages were forms of work, such as: individual, pair, group and team work [48 p.118]. Modern methods of teaching foreign languages are divided into two types - traditional and innovative. These methods have own upsides and downsides.

The traditional ways of teaching rely upon classical set of tools. The following tasks may be involved:
